The Interlocal Purchasing System (TIPS) is a National Cooperative Purchasing Program for use by schools, colleges, universities, cities, counties, non-profits and other government entities. Membership is available in all 50 states. Region 8 Education Service Center, located in Pittsburg, Texas is the lead agency for the cooperative. The Education Service Centers were established by the Texas Legislature by Chapter 8 of the Texas Education Code: http://www.statutes.legis.state.tx.us/Docs/ED/htm/ED.8.htm The bidding statute for the lead agency is Chapter 44.031 of the Texas Education Code: http://www.statutes.legis.state.tx.us/Docs/ED/htm/ED.44.htm
